New custom-invitation company Alia Designs (650-387-3330, aliadesigns.com), a sister duo based in Chicago and San Mateo, California, works one-on-one with clients to design exquisite fantasy creations that arrive in silk boxes embellished with materials sourced from around the world, including freshwater pearls, fabrics, jacquard ribbons, and beading.

"The boxes eventually become great keepsakes for guests, as well, because after the wedding they can use them to store photos or jewelry," says co-owner Puneet Messler. Cost: \$35 and up per invitation ensemble.




